

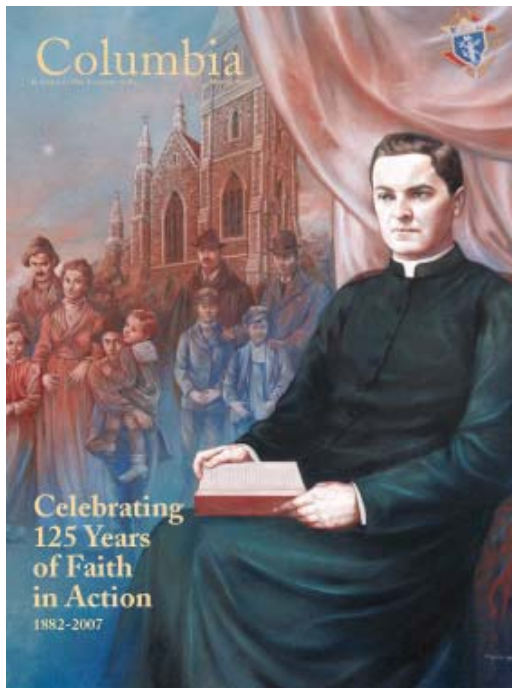

PATRIOTS' FESTIVAL

In one of the largest, and most meaningful community programs ever spearheaded by Council 7406, a Patriots'

Festival is being planned for November 10 along Mooresville's Main Street. The festival is intended to put the Knights of Columbus 4th Degree principle of Patriotism into action and into the full view of the community. The festival has tremendous support from the Town of Mooresville, the Chamber of Commerce, the Mooresville School District, local businesses and civic organizations including several national groups.

The festival will honor all servicemen and women of the area, especially those who have seen combat as they fought for our country, liberty and traditions.

Activities planned include an Honor Walk for veterans, military displays from all branches, NASCAR exhibits, a character luncheon for kids, a Little Patriot's area, a Marine Corp Birthday Celebration (Nov 10th is the Corps' birthday), a formal flag retirement ceremony by the scouts and more.

Local news and radio stations will be on hand to cover the event.

Main Street will be lined with displays, food vendors and merchandisers, all of which will stress the theme of Patriotism. According to Chris Baker, project manager for the festival, between 20,000 and 30,000 people are expected to attend.

One of the highlights of the festival will be a parade of possibly 6,000 area veterans. Baker points out that full participation of the Council will be necessary to make this a success. As the date draws near, volunteers will be requested for various positions. Upcoming Council meetings, e-mail and Knightlines will be used to keep all brothers informed. Mark the date – November 10.
